

BYLAW NO. 873
OF THE
TOWN OF KILLAM
IN THE PROVINCE OF ALBERTA

A BYLAW OF THE TOWN OF KILLAM IN THE PROVINCE OF ALBERTA TO AMEND THE BYLAW TO PROVIDE FOR THE REGULATION OF STREETS AND THOROUGHFARES IN THE TOWN OF KILLAM.

WHEREAS the *Traffic Safety Act* authorizes a municipality to regulate and control vehicle traffic as well as parking on streets and property within the municipality;

AND WHEREAS the *Municipal Government Act* allows a municipality to pass Bylaws as well as designate authority with respect to streets under its direction, control, and management;

NOW THEREFORE the Council or the Town of Killam in the Province of Alberta enacts to pass a bylaw for the purpose of regulating, controlling and managing highways within the Town of Killam as follows:

AND THEREFORE, the Council of the Town of Killam in the Province of Alberta to Amend the Bylaw 773B to provide for "***Use of Flashing Green Lights***". This Bylaw may also be cited as the Town of Killam "Traffic Control Bylaw"

This Bylaw may be cited as "Bylaw 873, amending the Town of Killam Bylaw 773B Town of Killam "Traffic Control Bylaw" as follows:

Section 10 "Authority to Erect, Remove or Alter Traffic Control Devices" is amended by adding Part 10.5 "USE OF FLASHING GREENLIGHTS".

Section 10.5. Use of Flashing Green Lights to read:

- (a) Full-time or volunteer firefighters may carry, on or in a vehicle, other than an emergency vehicle, a lamp that produces intermittent flashes of green light and may operate the lamp if the vehicle is proceeding to a fire or other emergency.
- (b) No person other than a full-time or volunteer firefighter shall operate a lamp that produces intermittent flashes of green light.
- (c) Nothing in this section shall be construed as to permit a full-time or volunteer firefighter to operate a vehicle in contravention of the *Traffic Safety Act*, Provincial regulations, or this Bylaw.
- (d) If any portion of this Bylaw is declared invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the invalid portion shall be severed, and the remainder of the Bylaw is deemed valid.

This Bylaw shall come into force and effect upon the date that it is finally passed.

READ a first time this 17th day of February 2022.

READ a second time this 17th day of February 2022.

READ a third and final time this 17th day of February 2022.
