

**PUBLIC NOTICE TO THE ELECTORS OF THE TOWN OF KILLAM  
BORROWING BYLAW NO. 898  
SECTION 251 – THE ALBERTA MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT ACT**

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Town of Killam, in the Province of Alberta, has given first reading to the borrowing Bylaw No. 898 which will, upon final passage and approval, authorizes the Council of the Municipality to incur indebtedness by the issuance of debenture(s) in the amount of \$1,760,470 for the purpose of developing and servicing Phase 2 of residential lands at 5302-45 Avenue which includes site grading, underground utilities, power, street lights and road construction for 9 serviced residential lots and sanitary lift station and force main for an additional 50 residential lots all for resale.

The total cost of the aforesaid project amounts to \$ 1,760,470, which is the amount to be borrowed on the credit and security of the municipality at large by the issue of debentures. The debentures are to be repayable to the Government of Alberta or another authorized financial institution in Fifty (50) equal consecutive semi-annual instalments of combined principal and interest, the annual interest not to exceed the interest rate as fixed from time to time by the Province of Alberta or authorized financial institution ;


**NOW THEREFORE NOTICE** is hereby given by the Council of the Town of Killam that, unless a petition of the owners for a vote on By-law No. 898 is demanded, as provided for by the terms of Section 231 of the *Municipal Government Act*, the said Council may pass the said borrowing by-law.

All persons interested are hereby notified and they are required to govern themselves accordingly.

**INFORMATION FOR ELECTORS**

Pursuant to Section 1(i) of the *Municipal Government Act* an "elector" means:

1. A person who is eligible to vote in the election for a councillor under the Local Authorities Election Act.

Pursuant to section 47(1) of the Local Authorities Election Act a person is eligible to vote in an election if he:

- a) is at least 18 years old,
- b) is a Canadian citizen, and
- c) has resided in Alberta for the 6 consecutive months immediately preceding election day and is resident in the area on election day.

A poll may be demanded in the Town of Killam by electors equal in number to at least 10% of the population and in accordance with the provisions of Section 223 of the *Municipal*

*Government Act* and in accordance with the provisions of Section 251 of the *Municipal Government Act*.

The petition for a vote must be received by the Chief Administrative Officer within 15 days of the last publication of this notice and shall contain on each page "an accurate and identical statement of the purpose of the petition". (Further requirements of the petition are provided in section 224 of the *Municipal Government Act*.)
